The California Water Code (CWC) directs DWR to report to the legislature once every five years on the status of submitted plans. In meeting this legislative reporting requirement, DWR reviews all submitted plans.

DWR's review of the City's 2010 UWMP has found that the plan has generally addressed the requirements of the CWC. In your 2015 Plan, DWR recommends the District specify which Target Method was used to calculate the Interim and 2020 gpcd (see Water Code 10608.20 (b)). We were able to calculate that Target Method 3 was used, but this was not specified in the Plan.

DWR's review of plans is limited to assessing whether suppliers have addressed the required legislative elements. In its review, DWR does not evaluate or analyze the supplier's UWMP data, projections, or water management strategies.
